Introduction

Corporate Ethics Managers are an intricate part of today's corporate structure. They manage the consistency of compliance and ethics by responding to ethics questions and issues, monitoring regulations, drafting and updating policies and standard operating procedures, monitoring compliance and ethics policies for potential gaps, and collaborating with company stakeholders to communicate information to employees.

The Certified Corporate Ethics Manager certification issued by the Management and Strategy Institute covers multiple aspects of corporate ethics. You'll be tested on your knowledge of business ethics and how to implement an ethical compliance program within the workplace. Ethical decision making, social responsibility and whistle blowing are all covered within the scope of this program.
