Key Components of a Work Breakdown Structure

1 Work Packages

2 Deliverables

Tangible or intangible outcomes that are produced during a project.

3 Activities

Specific tasks or actions needed to complete a deliverable.

4 Dependencies

Relationships between different work packages, activities, and deliverables.

Benefits of Using Work Breakdown Structure



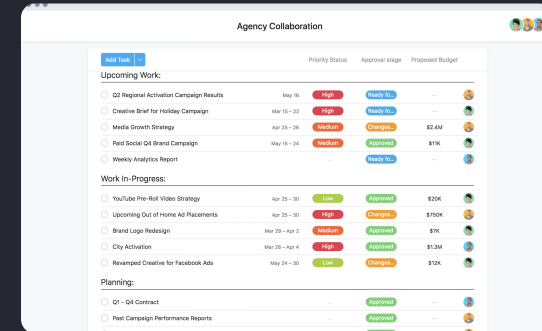
Enhanced Collaboration

Improved Project Management

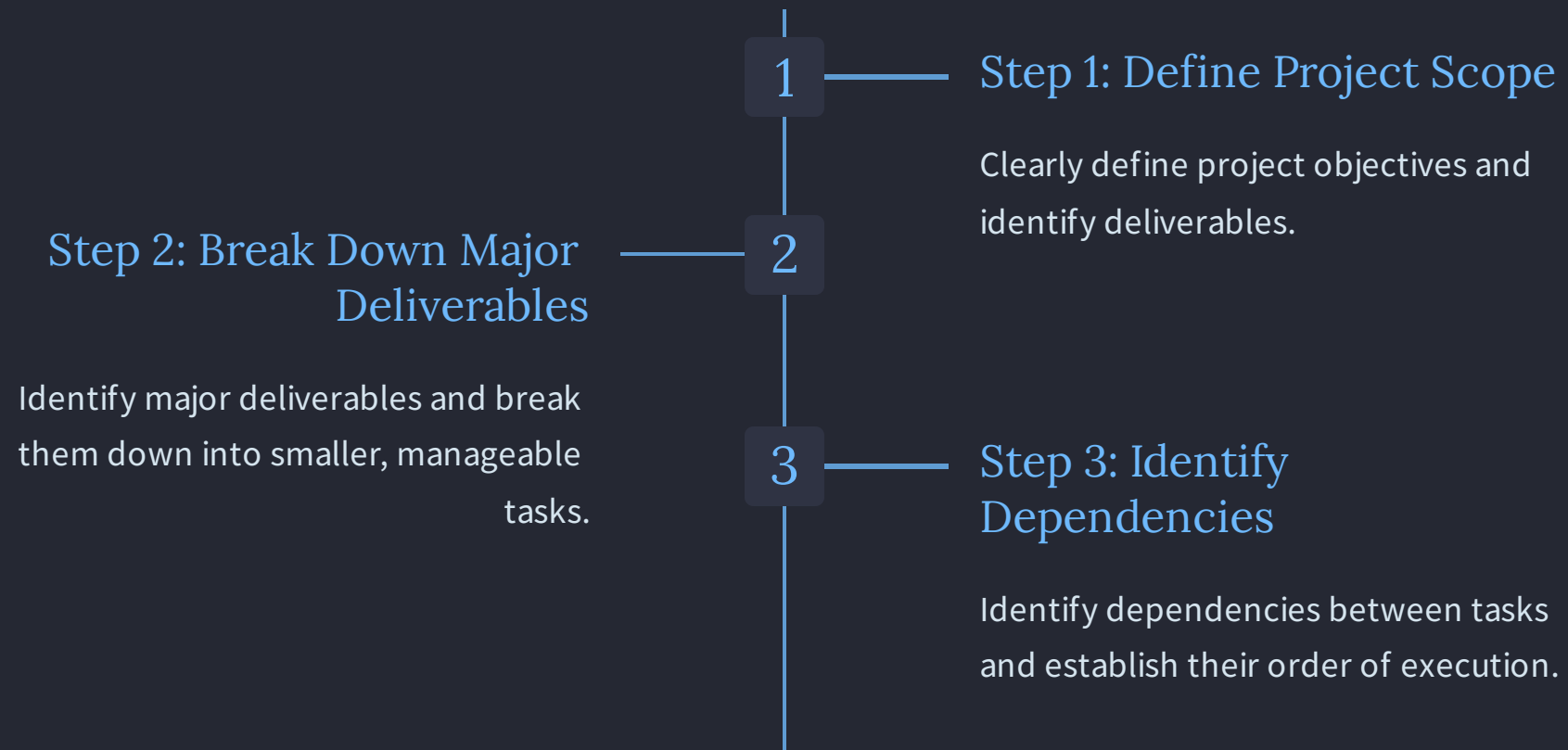
Enables better planning, scheduling, and resource allocation.
